
SEPTEMBER CORRECTION

Bairnsdale Rotary Club Assisting Farmers

The day after celebrating 80 years of serving the community, the Rotary Club of Bairnsdale was contacted by the Rotary Club of Lilydale in the Yarra Valley. They had been given a donation of \$10,000.00 and wanted to assist the farmers in the Bairnsdale area. They acquired 100 bales of hay which they hoped to bring to Bairnsdale. After negotiations their end they managed to deliver the much needed bales to Bairnsdale, free of charge. (Gillian Reeve, RC of Bairnsdale)

Once Bairnsdale the Rotary Club of Bairnsdale liaising with the Gippsland Farmers Relief Inc identified 10 farmers who needed the hay. Over a couple of weeks these bales have been picked up by very grateful farmers which hopefully will ease the situation for them. Once again with the help of local businesses.

As hay is in short supply around the state they were unable to use all of the \$10,000.00, so together with a personal donation, surplus funds have been passed on to the Rotary Club of Bairnsdale. Other donations from the club and private donors are now being used to supply vouchers to farmers as identified by the Gippsland Farmers Relief and co-ordinators in the Buchan area. Local businesses have come on board by agreeing to accept these vouchers which will be reimbursed by the Rotary Club.

> Over the last few weeks a lot of focus has been on the plight of farmers in NSW and Queensland, with not much mentioned about this area, which is experiencing a "green drought". Although the paddocks look green there is no substance to the growth and the outlook is not promising. Rotary Australia is managing the monies raised through the Channel 9 appeal and all Rotarians know that this money will be distributed and used in the most beneficial way Willaton Transport, Gippsland reaching the organisations and farmers most in need, but funds are needed here too.

The Rotary Club of Bairnsdale is now committed to helping the wonderful community that they are part of, so together with the other clubs in our area hope to make more of a difference.

The generosity of businesses has been heart-warming as they do what they can to help the farmers, but as we know communities always come together in times of need. This will be an ongoing project of Rotary until the hard times have passed so any help would be gratefully received.
